NO CHARGE FOR CLASSES unless otherwise specified (\$). Open to active duty, reserve, retired personnel, family members, and DoD employees, except as noted in the program descriptions. Schedules are subject to change.

ACING THE INTERVIEW. Interview skills are key to a successful interview. Attend this workshop to learn how to present yourself as the best candidate for the job. You will gain an understanding of what to bring for the interview, become familiar with various interview formats, and prepare to ask and answer questions effectively.

AFTER GPS. This class is a follow-on to the 5-day TGPS workshop. Attendees will have the opportunity to hear how veterans experienced transition from the military to civilian workforce; attend informative briefs from Tricare, Workforce Development Office, Disabled American Veterans, and State Veterans Affairs. The workshop ends with an employer panel, to assist members to understand what hiring managers are looking for in prime candidates. Must have attended RTAP, STAP or Transition GPS.

ANGER MANAGEMENT. Designed for people who want to better control their anger in either work or social/family settings. A variety of specific, usable suggestions are given to assist people in managing the very human emotion of anger.

ANNUAL RETIREE SEMINAR. This seminar is for military retirees and their family members, widows, and widowers. Topics include benefits, commissary/exchange information, TRICARE, veterans/legal services and more.

BOOT CAMP FOR NEW DADS. New babies don't come with owner's manuals. Holding, feeding, diaper-changing and working with Mom are all new experiences for first-time fathers-to-be ("Rookies"). Dads with 2 – 4 month old babies ("Vets") help the "Rookies" with hands-on experience. This "dads only" three and one-half hour workshop is "coached" by dads.

CAPSTONE EVENT. A workshop to measure a service member's transition readiness from a military to civilian career. If needed, service member will be connected to external agencies that offer additional assistance to ensure a successful transition to civilian life. This shall be completed no later than 90 days prior to separating/retiring. A prerequisite for this event is Transition GPS (Goal, Plans, and Success). Completion of this component is mandatory.

CAR BUYING STRATEGIES. What you should know before purchasing a car such as determining what you can afford, planning for the various expenditures of a car, and learning to get the best deal on the purchase. Learn about negotiating, planning for various expenditures, trade-ins, discounts, financing and more.

CAREER CHOICES: DO WHAT YOU ARE. Discover the perfect career for you through the secrets of personality assessment. Focus on your natural strengths and learn which strategies career experts recommend for your type. Take a look at your type and see how this knowledge can stimulate you to explore new avenues.

COMMAND FINANCIAL SPECIALIST (CFS) FORUM. Quarterly forum in accordance with OPNAVINST 1740.5B. Command Financial Specialists meet and share ideas about their respective programs. Guest speakers provide up-to-date information on financial issues. We discuss trends, what we have seen during the quarter, and decide if we need to train throughout all commands on these current issues. Command Master Chiefs/Career Counselors are encouraged to attend.

COMMAND INDIVIDUAL AUGMENTEE COORDINATOR (CIAC) FORUM. CIACs meet, network, and receive updated information which allows them to effectively assist IA Sailors and their families.

OMBUDSMAN ASSEMBLY MEETINGS. All officially appointed ombudsmen are required to represent the command at the local Ombudsman Assembly meetings. Local ombudsman assemblies frequently serve as venues for ongoing training of ombudsmen. Assemblies serve as liaison for policy discussion and clarification by appropriate local agencies regarding issues of interest to ombudsmen and command family members.

PARENTING GROUP. This interactive parenting group assists parents to better nurture their children, allowing their children to grow into responsible adults and loving parents to their own children. PRE-SEPARATION BRIEFING (USAF PERSONNEL ONLY). DTM 12-007 mandates retiring or separating members receive preseparation counseling NLT 90 days prior to leaving the service. This mandatory counseling covers VA benefits and entitlements, employment, education, medical, and community resources, among others.

SAPR VICTIM ADVOCATE INITIAL TRAINING. DON Civilian employees and Active duty Navy volunteers will be trained as SAPR Victim Advocates who will be responsible for providing information and emotional support for sexual assault victims during medical, investigative, and legal processes. Deployable commands are required per OPNAVINST 1752.1B to have trained SAVI Victim Advocates. Contact the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response office via CNI_PRLH_SAPRHawaii@navy.mil for more information and to register.

SAPR VICTIM ADVOCATE REFRESHER TRAINING. Refresher training is required to provide continuous education for current certified SAPR Victim Advocates. Training addresses the most current information and guest speakers from a variety of related organizations. Contact the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response office at CNI_PRLH_SAPRHawaii@navy.mil for more information and to register.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT GROUP. This group is designed to increase participants' conflict resolution skills in relationships. Air Force members may register through a transition counselor at the MFSC.


